Excursion Management Plan- Dinosaurs Alive! Fremantle

Purpose of the Excursion

Dinosaurs Alive! is an exhibition relating to the natural history of the world. Key Learning Areas that directly link to our content are Society and Environment and Science.

Environment

The Dinosaurs Alive! exhibition is located at the Fremantle Esplanade.

A short walk from the Fremantle CBD, the Esplanade is located on Marine Terrace next to Fremantle Fishing Boat Harbour and close to public transport links and parking lots.

Toilets are available at Fremantle Esplanade (located opposite Cliff Street and opposite Essex Street) and there are several automatic teller machines and numerous restaurants and cafés located nearby.

All areas of the venue are wheelchair accessible. The nearest accessible toilet is located at the Reserve, opposite Cliff Street.

Transport

School Bus – There is free school bus parking available. Please see the map on page 5 for details.

Bus – The free Fremantle Cat Bus runs every ten to fifteen minutes seven days a week and stops at the Esplanade. Please see www.transperth.wa.gov.au for exact times.

Train – Fremantle Esplanade is about a ten-minute walk from Fremantle Train Station and Bus Port. Please see www.transperth.wa.gov.au for exact times.

Car – Paid parking is available at Marine Terrace Car Park (53 bays), Esplanade Car Park (197 bays) and Fishing Boat Harbour Car Park (461 bays). Limited paid public street parking is also available on Marine Tce. On average it costs \$1.60 per hour to park in the Fremantle CBD. 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Student's Capacity

Dinosaurs Alive! caters for audiences from Kindergarten to Year 7.

Visiting the Dinosaurs Alive! exhibition provides students with an opportunity to engage with issues such as climate change and extinction theories while learning about subjects such as fossils, robotics and animal classification.

Supervisor/Supervisory Team

It is a requirement to provide a supervisory team for school excursions to the Dinosaurs Alive! exhibition. The school supervisory team must accompany the students throughout the excursion, actively monitoring behavior and intervene as necessary. The ratio of teacher to student is as follows:

Kindergarten – Year 3, one teacher per five students
Year 4 – Year 7, one teacher per ten students.

Please be aware that members of the general public may be visiting the exhibition at the same time as your school and we would appreciate your students demonstrating responsible behaviour to ensure an enjoyable experience for all.

Please be punctual, allowing extra time for toilet breaks etc. Late arrival may result in abbreviated tour experiences.

Current Accreditations and Qualifications

- The Exhibition Manager and a number of staff hold current senior first-aid certification. First Aid kits are available throughout the Exhibition space through one of these staff members. If you require first aid, please notify a staff member as soon as possible.

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Identification of Excursion Participants

Identification of excursion participants is the responsibility of the visiting school.

It can be helpful to Dinosaurs Alive! staff if students are dressed in school uniform, for clear identification, and if the school supervisory team members wear a name badge.

Communication Strategies

School supervisory team can have access to a telephone line through the Exhibitions Manager.

School supervisory teams are encouraged to bring with them a mobile telephone that they can be contacted on and can use to call out during their site visit if necessary. Limiting the use of mobile telephones is appreciated in the venue, for the consideration of other visitors and exhibition staff.

Emergency Response Plan

In the event of an emergency it is essential that all school visitors take directions from exhibition staff.

Teachers can increase safety by always ensuring that they meet the minimum supervision requirements and by strongly encouraging students to stay in their groups with their adult supervisors.

If evacuation is essential all visitors will be assembled at a common point or another designated safe area. Teachers will need to do a roll call and must immediately inform exhibition staff if any students are missing.

It is suggested that school supervisory teams have access to a list of names of participating students, contact telephone numbers, student medical information and relevant health information of supervisors.



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Briefing Students and Supervisors

The Dinosaurs Alive! Education Officer will send you a booking confirmation letter once you have made your booking, which will contain relevant information for your excursion.

Visitors who have booked visits should present themselves at the front desk of the exhibition and inform the exhibition staff of their arrival. School supervisory teams are encouraged to prepare students for the visit by outlining expected behaviour and learning outcomes.
